Rationale for Music and Art

- The use of creative expressions, as a means of promoting a particular cause or advocating for a social, political or environmental issue.
- Their universal language, can convey powerful messages, capture emotions, and inspire people to take action or raise awareness about important issues.



Rationale Cont'd

- Strong emotional connection: Music and art create strong emotional connections with youth, allowing them to engage with issues in a personal and meaningful way.
 - Creativity and expression: Music and art allow youth to express themselves creatively, giving them a voice and a platform to share their opinions and thoughts on important issues.
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Rationale 2

- **Persuasive communication:** Music and art can be used to convey complex messages and ideas in a way that is easily understood by a wide audience, making them effective tools for advocacy and social change.
- **Visibility:** youth can use music and art to gain visibility and reach an even broader audience, amplifying their message and impact.

Rationale 3

- **Accessibility:** Music and art are accessible forms of expression that require minimal resources, making them widely available to young people regardless of their background or socioeconomic status.
- **Community building:** Music and art can bring people together, creating a sense of community and shared purpose as youth work together to advocate for change.

Back ground

- The rights of persons with disabilities need to be fought for.
- Development programmes (Youth Centered programmes) that are not designed to be inclusive will not easily give youths with disabilities this right.
- The people best placed to make the argument are those who stand most to gain from it- namely youths with disabilities.
- They need to become advocates for inclusive programmes. But often these are the very people who are marginalized and powerless within the society.
- They need to become empowered and equipped with skills of developing creative initiatives that can make them effective advocates as well as foster peer to peer support.

Project Outcome:

Improved ability of young people with disabilities to advocate for change and participate in local and national decision making.



Objectives

- To raise awareness and promote advocacy for inclusion among youth with disabilities.
- To provide a platform for youth with disabilities to showcase their talents and advocate for inclusion.
- To engage youth with disabilities in music therapy that nurtures their creativity and self-expression.
- To create alliances with schools, music organizations, and disability organizations to promote the inclusion of youth with disabilities in education, employment, and social inclusion.

Approach

Component	Activity
Music Workshops:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduced to different genres of music• Helped them explore their creativity.• Tailored workshop towards their specific needs, incorporating music therapy that aids self-expression and communication.
Music Production	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Engaged youth with disabilities in producing music that raises awareness about inclusion and promotes disability rights.• Songwriting, composition, and performance,• Concerts
Advocacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• provided information, training, and opportunities to leverage their voices for creating a more inclusive society

Outcomes

- Increased awareness about the importance of inclusion among youth with disabilities.
- Improved communication, self-expression, and creativity of youth with disabilities
- A platform for youth with disabilities to showcase their talents and advocate for inclusion.
- Increased partnerships between disability organizations, music organizations, and schools to promote inclusion.



Potential Challenges/limitations

- Limited access to resources
- Inconsistency in creativity
- Lack of technical know how
- Limited time and resources
- Cultural barriers
- Lack of Interest



Examples of music advocates

- Stevie Wonder and Johnnie Crescendo are two examples of musicians who have been strong advocates for disability rights. Stevie Wonder has been an outspoken advocate for disability rights for over 40 years, and his music often addresses themes related to disability inclusion and accessibility.
- Johnnie Crescendo is a Canadian musician who has cerebral palsy, and his music is dedicated to raising awareness about disability issues.
